East Campus Hustle n' Bustle

The Dayton Christian Center East campus has many new additions to talk about. The newest addition is the GED Program. Clients may study as needed and then take the practice test to see if they are ready to take the GED test. Tutors are available during study times. Once ready, clients may contact the testing sites to set up a date and time to take the GED test.

We have also recently added the ECOT computer area for youth that need to complete their High School education and that need tutoring, but don't fit into the traditional classroom approach. So far, we have 4 students who are working on their programs and we are expecting the program to grow, as more parents and guardians search for alternative education opportunities.

The VITA tax program has just wrapped up for the 2008 tax season. This program runs annually starting with the kickoff in January and con-

tinuing thru until April 15 each year. This is a free service to low income families and is completely volunteer run. We saw a very large increase in the number of clients served through this program and are expecting that this is because of our fantastic volunteers who return year after year and the staff support at the Dayton Christian Center. We have received nothing but positive feedback from those who used the service this year.

Did You Know?

- Each week we still provide free Panera bread and bagels that are available for Dayton Christian Center clients and the surrounding community.
- The Computer Lab is open each day from 10am to 6pm. Computer classes can be scheduled for those who want to learn computer basics.
- Anger management classes, conflict resolution, as well as classes on self esteem, communication

- skills and listening skills are provided each week.
- Teen Pregnancy Prevention Classes are available each week from 4-5pm on Monday for teens ages 10-19 and their par-
- The Community Without Walls program is busy as ever assisting families and individuals with finding jobs, resources and referrals and case management on an ongoing basis for those who qualify.

Have you ever been faced with a choice in life? Now think back to when you were a kid. What kinds of choices did you have to make? The Dayton Christian Center has a program called CHOICES (Creating Healthy Opportunities for Individuals through Commitment and Empowerment for Success) This program is designed to promote the self esteem of young people through a variety of activities. The youth enrolled in CHOICES have the opportunity to learn proper skin care, how to shop and dress for everyday and special functions, posture training, community service, and modeling.

Currently, there are 20 youth involved in CHOICES. This highly energetic bunch meets every Saturday at our West campus for sev-

eral hours honing in their skills and bonding as a group.
