You Can Help!

Have you been wondering what your financial donations can do at the Dayton Christian Center and how you can make a BIG impact?

The following gifts can go a long way:

- \$5,000 New flooring for the Toddler and Preschool classrooms.
- \$1000 2 full weeks of case management services at our East Dayton location.
- \$500 New windows for our food pantry that will be reopening in East Dayton.
- \$500 − 3 months of everyday supplies for our Childcare program in West Dayton
- \$250 Feeding programs and food for approximately 100 children and adults at both locations
- \$100 − 2 months of programs/trips for our children in West Dayton

- ♦ \$50 Approximate cost of serving one child for one week
- \$25 Approximate cost of serving one adult client one time.

Some companies use electronic filing which eliminates the need for a matching gift form. If your employer does have a Matching Gift Program, request a matching gift form from your employer (or fill one out electronically), and send your part completed and signed with your gift to the Dayton Christian Center

In your gift, please let us know if there is a specific project you would like to support so we may designate your gift appropriately. Any gifts undesignated will be used where the need is the greatest and are always welcomed and preferred. Also, if you wish to remain anonymous, please indicate that as well and we will respect your privacy.

Semester of Service



Semester of Service (SOS) is a unique opportunity for University of Dayton undergraduate students to take a semester away from classes and

serve full-time in non-profit centers for inner-city children and teens, individuals who are homeless, and neighborhoods undergoing revitalization. Students gain new skills, insight into social justice issues, and earn a stipend -- all while continuing their UD education.

The Dayton Christian Center has been blessed to be an agency who has benefited greatly from this program since Fall of 2004.

Each student has to apply to the SOS program, tour all of the agencies that they are interested in, and the student then calls to set up an interview with the agencies they wish to work in. After the interviews have been completed each student ranks their top choices and the agencies in return get to rank the students.



This semester (January—May) our SOS student has been Kevin Berry and boy have we kept him busy. He has been working at both the East and

West locations helping out where needed like painting projects, assisting in the school age rooms, and moving furniture.

The Dayton Christian Center allows the students to take ownership of a project of their choice. Kevin's project has been setting up Big Brothers, Big Sisters at the West Campus. The Big Brother's and Big Sisters (UD Students) get together each Friday with the kids at the center and do things like play games, extra activities like skating and a trip to UD. The main purpose of this program is to develop one on one relationships and creating a role model for the younger kids.

We deeply appreciate Kevin's dedication to the Dayton Christian Center and hope he will continue his involvement after his semester of service is over.
